
#### **Congregation Meeting, November 14, 2021**




#### ADVENT BIBLE STUDY Because of Bethlehem: Love is Born. Hope is Here. By Max Lucado

#### **Council Highlights**

#### **Property Committee:**

- Approved the purchase of a new defibrillator.
- Office space for *She's Somebody's Daughter* is almost completed. Still working on lease agreement.
- We continue to wait on the elevator door and the generator replacement.
- Approved the purchase of a new exterior sign near the sidewalk from Art Signs.
- *Frontier Girls* (a scout-like organization) has requested our church to be their charter organization. Approved on trial basis for one year.
- The local Guild of Organists will hold their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary gathering in our Fellowship Hall on October 23.

#### Finance Committee:

- Committee is preparing the 2022 budget. Thank you to each committee for their input.
- Approved the LARC Committee's request to use First Lutheran's EIN to establish a new checking account for this organization of which we are a member.

#### Worship & Music Committee:

- Updated Covid Protocals were agreed upon: maximum of 10 in the choir loft for anthems offering plates will again be placed at the doors, and masks should be worn.
- Tom Kriner is chairing a task team to update the livestreaming equipment.

#### **Congregational Meeting and Annual Meeting Dates:**

- Congregational meeting to elect new council members will be held November 14, 2021. Mary Beth McGraw-Warne and Barb Evans are willing to be nominated for a second term. Sally Herritt has also agreed to be nominated.
- Annual meeting to approve the budget will be January 30, 2022, with no potluck discussion time the evening prior.

#### Mutual Ministry:

• The council approved a sabbatical leave for Pastor Nicholson in the summer/fall of 2022.

Dear family in Christ:

Once in a while I come across some brief thoughts from a little book, "Day by Day We Magnify Thee – Daily Meditations from Luther's Writings arranged according to the Year of the Church." It was published in 1950 in Philadelphia by what was then Muhlenburg Press. I plan to share some of these with you from time to time through "First News First." The following are thoughts of Martin Luther on the Church; the scripture texts are from his translation.

#### THE WORD SHOWS WHETHER THE CHURCH IS PRESENT

I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. JOHN 17:6

There is no argument about whether there is on earth a Church which humans should obey. The battle begins when people must decide which is the true Church. As long as we judge according to human words and understanding we cannot settle this quarrel, nor can we find the true Church, but as we can reach certainty in the matter if we hear how Christ our Lord Himself describes and portrays the Church. Here He christens and depicts her as the little company which loves Christ and keeps His Word (for thus is



such love known and felt). 'My Word', He says, 'must remain and be kept, or there can be no Church'. The Word of Christ is here the rule and test whereby one can find and know the true Church, and by which she must set her course, for there must be a rule and order according to which the Church shall preach and act. It is not right that anyone speak and act as he/she likes, and claims that the Church has spoken, and acted by, the Holy Spirit. And that is why Christ binds His Church to His Word and gives it to her as a sign whereby one may enquire and test whether she possesses the Word, and teaches and preaches in accordance with it and does everything for the love of Christ.


