

### LIVING OUR BAPTISM

The first Sunday after the Epiphany traditionally commemorates the Baptism of Jesus and we hear a clear affirmation of God's love for him, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:17) We will commemorate this on January 8.

In baptism, the Holy Spirit came to Jesus and his mission on this earth was launched. In our baptism we, too, receive the gift of the Holy Spirit transforming our lives and propelling us into service in his Kingdom. The gifts of discipleship which we hear in the baptismal service are the promises made by our parents or guardians. As we grow in age and maturity we continue to walk in the waters of our baptism and commit our lives as we affirm our baptism.



To affirm our baptism (most notably at Confirmation, but also at other times) means that we pledge our intention to continue in the covenant God made with us in baptism:

- ✤ to live among God's faithful people,
- ♦ to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
- ◆ to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
- ★ to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and
- ♦ to **strive** for justice and peace in all the earth

(Evangelical Lutheran Worship, p. 236)

If we indeed affirm these things, our response is: "I do, and I ask God to help and guide me." So begins a daily claiming and re-discovering of the God-given gifts of discipleship. These gifts overlap and are intertwined as one gift flows into another and into faithful living. Our baptism sets us out on a lifelong journey that is characterized by our relationship to God, our relationship to our faith community, our relationship with our neighborhood, and our relationship to the wider world. Marked with the cross of Christ and sealed by the Spirit, we receive a new identity as followers of Jesus, and the story of Jesus becomes our story.

I encourage you to contemplate in this new year, how you will live out your baptismal calling and promises each and every day.
