LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

(Four blue candles are lit on the Advent wreath.)

Reader 1: Today we light the fourth candle on the Advent wreath, the candle that represents love. God had promised that his steadfast love would not depart from his people. He would remember his covenant promise. Now the time had come for his promise to be fulfilled.

Reader 2: In his grace, God chose Mary, a virgin in Nazareth of Galilee, to be the mother of our Lord. The virgin-born son would be the Son of God. He was to be named Jesus, which means "God saves."

Reader 3: The apostle John writes, "In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him."

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."




DISTRIBUTION
